# Our roster of 1,661 patients is the most we've ever served. Demand for our dialysis services has grown fast and we've flexed to respond.

Our peritoneal dialysis program, in which we support people who do one type of home dialysis, grew 25 percent in 18 months. In-center treatment numbers climbed 5 percent overall, but by much more in our South King County clinics. In response, we expanded capacity at our clinics in SeaTac and Renton, and got approval to add stations in Enumclaw. Meanwhile, our hospital services team performed 8 percent more treatments than in 2015.



In a perfect world, dialysis would no longer be necessary. With donor support, we work to make the perfect world a reality. One way we do that is with public health education.


## Financial strength furthers our mission




